Whilst the majority of the work will be completed during the first week of the holidays, some work may need to be completed during the second week.



# Please be aware of this

WhatsApp group encouraging self-harm in young people.

CNTW NHS Trust has made us aware of a WhatsApp group called "everyone you know x" which is circulating in North Tyneside. It is aimed at Year 6 students.

There are currently 500 members, and the group encourages members to self-harm.

Three young people (two from Gateshead and one from Northumberland) are in hospital following an overdose and they have disclosed that there is a social media trend whereby young people are being encouraged to take overdoses on a points scoring system eg, if admitted to hospital, if a liver specialist has been contacted etc.

As these young people are not from the North Tyneside area, and there is potential for this to affect other year groups, we are making all schools in our force area aware.

Optional boat trip at Seahouses for an extra cost. Please see Mrs Oakland for a letter. This trip is open to KS3 students.
















#### Importance of Attendance at Washington Academy

Your child should be in school every day. There is a clear connection between exam grades and attendance, and we want to work with you to ensure our pupils reach their full potential. Every day really does count.

#### How you can help:

- Contact school daily to report an absence.
- If your child has a medical appointment, please ensure they don't have the whole day off and come into school before and after where possible.
- Communicate with the school if there are any issues at home we can support you with or that may be affecting attendance.
- Bring in medical evidence e.g. a prescription, appointment card, hospital letter. Whether the absence is authorised is dependent on their attendance record and the discretion of the Attendance Team.
- Only take your child on holiday during the allocated school breaks (which is 13 weeks per year) Fines may be issued if holidays are taken during school time.
