Students Blast Off with RAF STEM Challenge

This week, 60 Year 8 & 9 students took part in the Road to RIAT: Blast Off STEM Day and Competition, supported by the Royal Air Force and the RAF Charitable Trust and delivered by The Smallpeice Trust. Our school is one of only 60 schools across the UK selected for this exciting opportunity, which allows students to explore the future of space exploration

through a series of hands-on STEM challenges. Students worked through four interactive stages, developing teamwork, problem-solving and engineering skills while learning about careers in science and aerospace. The students showed great enthusiasm and represented the school brilliantly throughout the event.
