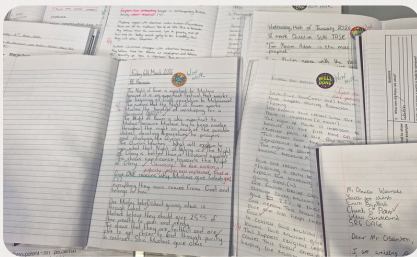


Student Spotlight
